Well here we are again: Not only that, but this is my last article as the PR Type for the Club. I would like to say thank you to all those who helped along the way, especially those who operated VE3JW over the past year. I believe I will put my name in for a regular shift down there this coming year. Why don't you think about doing a shift too when the new PR Type calls to ask? It's not too difficult with the new equipment and with the new booth almost finished, the whole atmosphere there will be so much better. You know, the Museum is doing such a fantastic job that Merv, VE3CV, mentioned that there was too much money being spent on it: As I write this there is still some work to be done but it looks like we should be operational again very soon. In that this will be the last mambler until September, keep tuned to the two Club nets and the Capital City FM Net for details regarding a possible official re-opening of the station. If you didn't see the new set-up taking shape at the last meeting, pop in and have a look. It's located just behind the weather display, just outside the steam locomotive train hall.

I wrote a little bit about Dayton last month and speculated on whether there would be enough interest in chartering a bus to take a group down to Dayton, Ohio for Hamvention '84. I did get some prices and I did mention it at the last meeting. There appeared to be some interest. The cost looks to be about \$90.00 per person for the bus and a group rate at a hotel would run about \$45.00 for three nites, double occupancy. So it would look like \$135.00 per person plus meals. That is not too bad I guess. This is all predicated on filling a 47 passenger highway bus (Carleton Bus Lines or Voyager Colonial Coach type). If there were not to be 47 to go, then the increased costs would have to be assumed by those taking part. For reasons which I need not go into here, I favour the plan offered by a bus company which needs 10% down at the time of booking so if we're going to go we shouldn't leave the decision too late. THE BOTTOM LINE

It is hard to believe, but this club year is over. The fall and winter seemed to go slow followed by a quick spring. It has been a busy year for us. The Amateur Radio Course stands out as the main club project of the year. In addition to the "gang of five", many other club members participated as "mentors". The course yielded three new amateurs with two more very close to having their tickets. We will be running the course again this fall, so if you want to help out let Russ know.

As usual, the club members participated in a wide variety of public service events from Superex way last summer, to the upcoming Operation Horsepeople. Speaking of Superex, I haven't heard any noise about it happening this year. Perhaps it will be

a last minute thing again.

Now on to some dull stuff. June is financial statement budget month. You will find both statements here in the Rambler. Most items are straight forward. The unusual items are Bank Interest, Amateur Radio Course, and Insurance. Our bank interest was much higher this year due to high interest rates earlier in the year and the opening of a haily interest savings account in addition to our chequing account. As can be seen, the Amateur Radio Course involved the largest movement of money this year. We had 27 students registered in the course. Expenses included honourariums to the course instructors, purchase of study guides and regulations handbooks, and the purchase of audio cassettes for morse code practice. I have a separate statement for the course if anyone is interested in the details. Finally the figures for our insurance appear artificially high. In the statement the \$\pi288.00\$ was for the 1982/83 year and the 1983/84 year. Both were paid during the same club year (\$\pi134.00\$ in July 1982 and \$154 in May 1983). At the present time our insurance comes due in May and we are not usually billed until June. This is just as we are changing executive. I have suggested to our insurance agent that it would help us if the policy came up for renewal in October. As a result I have budgeted w154 for this year plus an additional 376 to take us through to October 1984.

Sorry for taking up so much of the Rambler with financial matters, but June is the b-i-g month for the treasurer. See you

all again next year!

OVMRC MINUTES MAY 16, 1983

INTRODUCTION:

President Russ - VE3FSN opened the meeting at 20:02 hours and introduced: Gert - DF60Z. He also presented Bill - VE30AI, a successful graduate of the club's amateur radio course, with a name-tag. Twenty-six members and guests were present.

MINUTES OF APRIL MEETING:

Merv - VE3CV moved that the minutes be accepted. Seconded by Bob - VE3KLK, the motion was passed.

OLD BUSINESS:

President: Russ indicated that another amateur radio course will be held next year. He is also considering the possibility of

starting an advanced radio course as well.

Vice President: Dave - VE3KLX reported that Mike - VE3KMG is co-ordinator of the Ladies Great Ride for Cancer to be held on Sun. June 5th. Dave is organizing the emergency communications for "Operation Horse People" to be held on Sat. and Sun., June 11th and 12th. Bill - VE3NPG is co-ordinating communications for activities at Fiddler Greens Stables on Sun. May 29th.

Secretary: Nil report. Editor: Nil report.

Technical Advisor: Absent.

Public Relations: Mike - VE3LAR reported that the museum station is finally taking shape. Mike attended the Dayton Hamfest and had a good time. He plans to return next year and if there is enough interest he would arrange for the chartering of a bus. Cost of approximately \$80 for transportation and \$45 for 3 nights accommodation (double occupancy). Ten of the members expressed interest but it will take 47 people to fill the bus.

Treasurer: Pat - VE3KJQ reported that the club's bank balance stands at 2468.48 and membership is 104. The auction netted the club 574.55, broken down as follows: Canteen 205.55, Flea market

\$190.00, and the auction itself \$99.00.

Auction: Jerry - VE3CDS reported that all seemed to enjoy the auction and it was a very successful event. The only snag was that time ran out before all items could be sold. Rene - VE3JKR, who operated the canteen, noted that the large profit from the canteen was due to the 100 sandwiches which had been donated by the club executive. After the auction Mike - VE3LAR had a trailer full of heavy "junk" that no one wanted and was taken to the dump. Next year the club will try, as diplomatically as possible, to reject big or heavy items that are of no use to anyone.

RSO: Merv - VE3CV reminded the club about the RSO convention in the fall. With regard to the linking of repeaters in eastern and southern Ontario he reported that the club will be receiving a request to assist, through donations and labour, with the installation of the 440 Mhz. repeater at the VE3STF site. The new repeater will be linked to Bancroft by 220 Mhz. and then to Toronto

and onwards by a 440 Mhz. link.

CARF: Art - VE37S, reported that he has received 31 replies to the DOC proposal to have amateurs conduct the amateur exams. Most replies support the idea. He also reported that there is some activity promoting 14.140 Mhz. as an international calling frequency.

Field Day: Pres. Russ is still searching for a co-ordinator. Vance- VE30A0 offered to take on the task if he could get adequate help, but this offer died for lack of support. As it now stands, an OVMRC field day will not be held.

Elections: Vance - VE30AO reported that a full complement of officers is available to run for the club executive next month. At present, however, there is only one candidate for each position.

NEW BUSINESS:

VE3TWO: The President reported that new batteries have not been purchased as there are indications that a new site for the

repeater may have to be found. More details to come.

Entertainment: Bill Wilson - VE3NR provided the evenings entertainment by giving the club a fascinating talk on lightning. Bill described in simple terms how lightning is generated and the limited knowledge that is known about it. The hazards that lightning can present to amateur radio stations were explained as well as the techniques available to protect the equipment and its user.

Next Meeting: To be held on June 16, 1983 at the Museum of

Science and Technology at 2000 hours.

Executive Meeting: To be held at Dave - VE3KLX's QTH Thursday

May 26, 1983 at 19:30 hours.

Adjournment: Moved by Dave - VE3KLX and seconded by Bucky -VE3JRR, the meeting was adjourned at 21:48 hours.

Here are some notes in connection with WCY, World Communication Year. Until July 17, Canadian amateurs are permitted to use the special prefixes CI in Newfoundland and Labrador, CK in the Yukon, and CY in the rest of Canada. In the U.K., Marconi Radio Society will operate special-event station G2MT. This is the rebirth of Marconi Radio and Telegraph's famous station, 2MT, which operated from 1920 to 1923. 2MT has an interesting history. It provided reliable signals so early amateurs could adjust their equipment, and was once put off the air for broadcasting a musical offering by a Danish tenor: Finally, don't forget the IARU Radiosport Contest on July 9 and 10. To commemorate World Communications Year, CRRL is offering a series of special awards.

DOC has announced its examination schedule for 1984. Examinations will be conducted on February 4, April 18, June 20 and October 17. Applications must be filed with DOC before January 11, March 21, May 23 and September 19, or about one month before date of each writing.

FROM CARF NEWS SERVICE From time to time we get inquiries asking the number of Tariff Item under which certain Amateur gear enters duty free. Here are the facts as printed in bulletin number 35, dated November, 1980--The 14.3 to 16.6 percent rates formerly applied on various equipments from the U.K., the U.S.A., Japan and other countries in the Customs category of Most Favored Nations, was dropped in favor of free entry, effective October 29, 1980. The following equipment, under Tariff Item 44534-2 was affected: transmitters, receivers, transceivers and transverters assembled or in kit form, designed for use only on the Amateur bands as defined by the Radio Rogs; linear amplifiers, variable frequency oscillators and power supplies designed for use with the foregoing and parts of all of the foregoing. Microphones, antennas and other accessories, however, are still dutiable. The full story was reported in "TCA -- The Canadian Amateur" for December, 1980.


